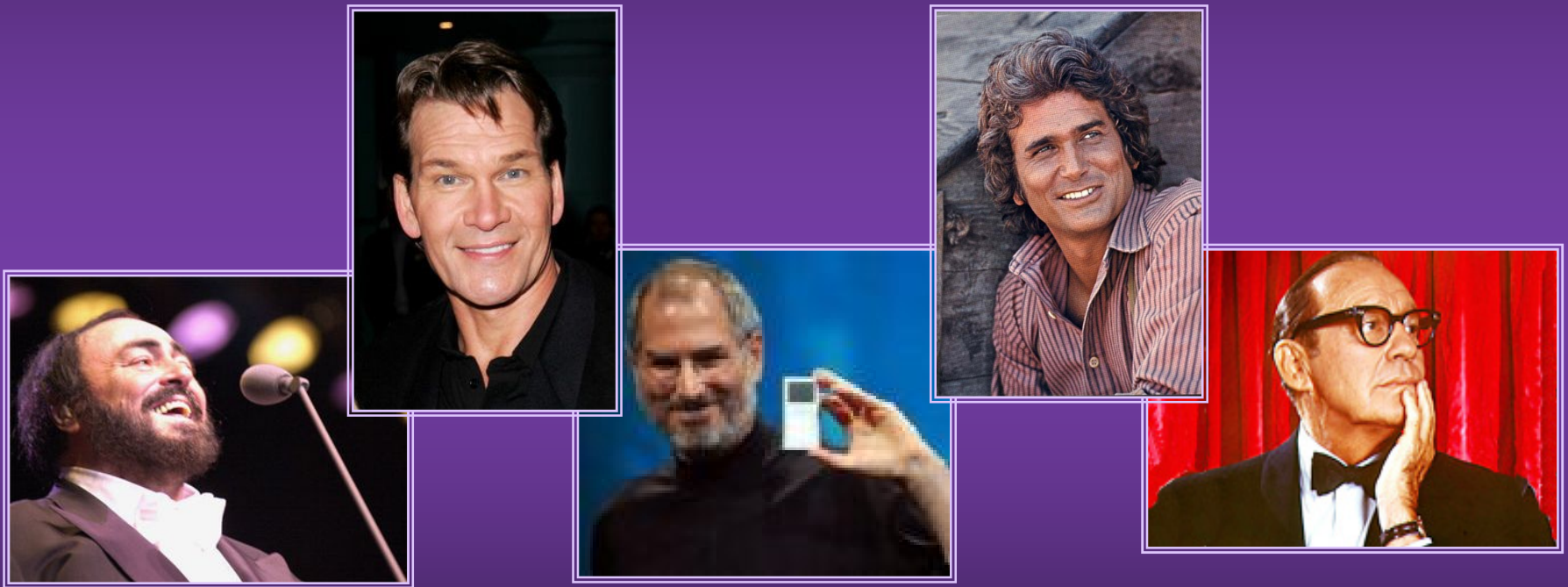

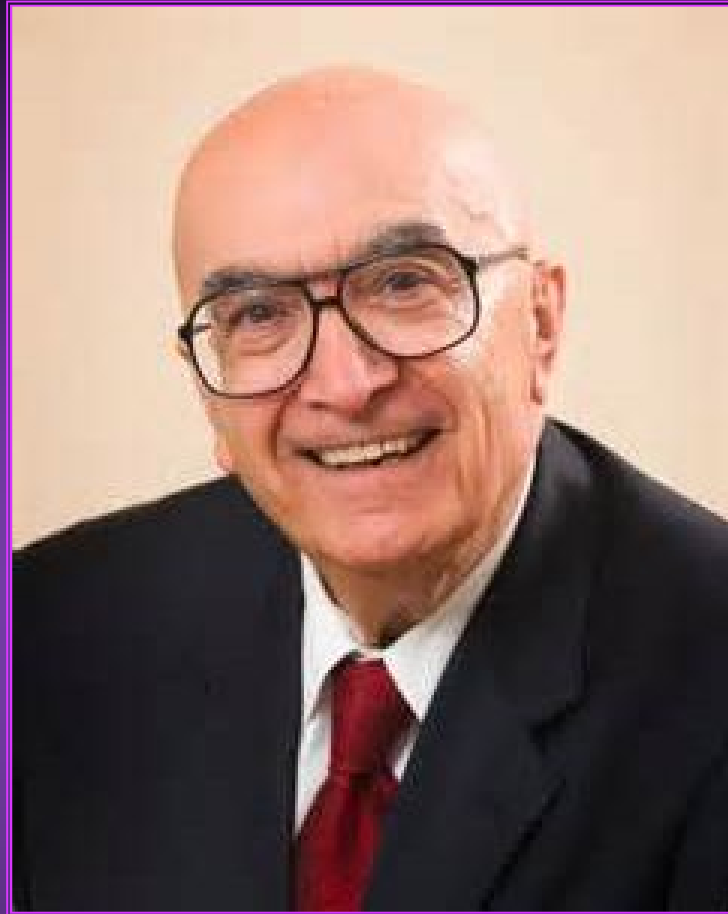
Jay Cochrane – 2013

Young and the Restless

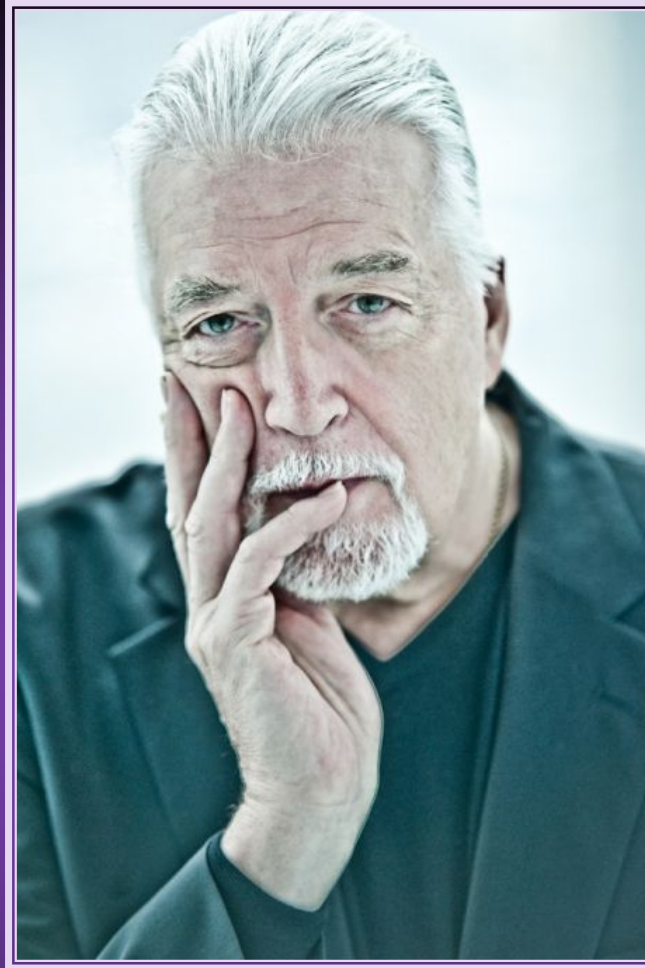


Lotfi Mansouri – 2013

Bullpen Coach of San Diego Padres. Pitched with the Athletics, Indians, Rangers and Orioles in the late 80's



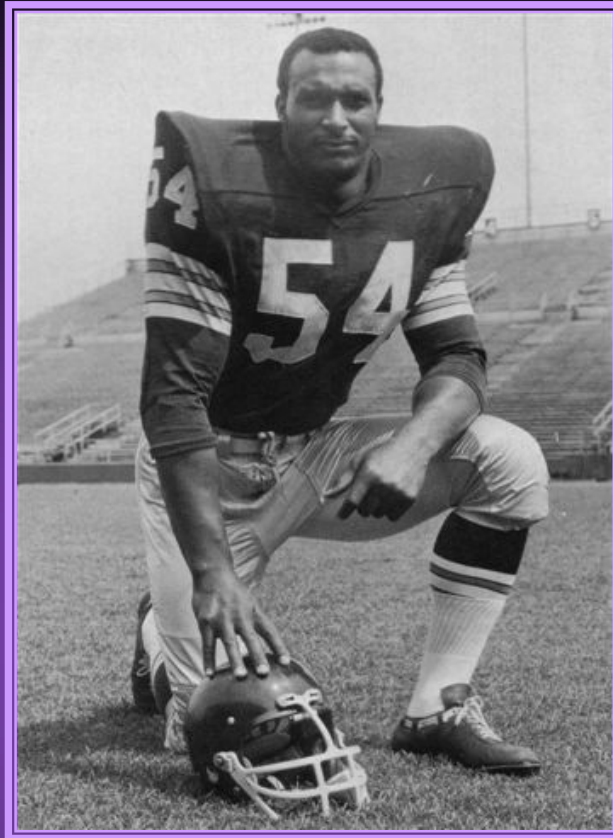
Ben Gazzara - 2012

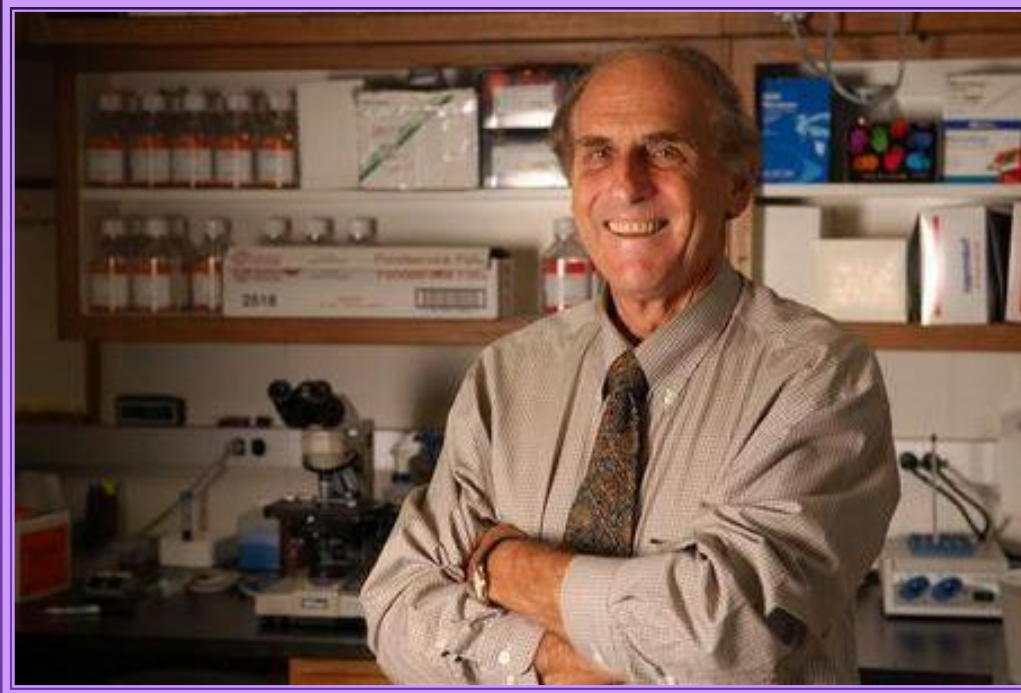
Edison 'Ed' Dean Harrington – 2011

Actor – Television, movies and stage. Best remembered for his role as Adam Cartwright on Bonanza and his title role on Trapper John MD



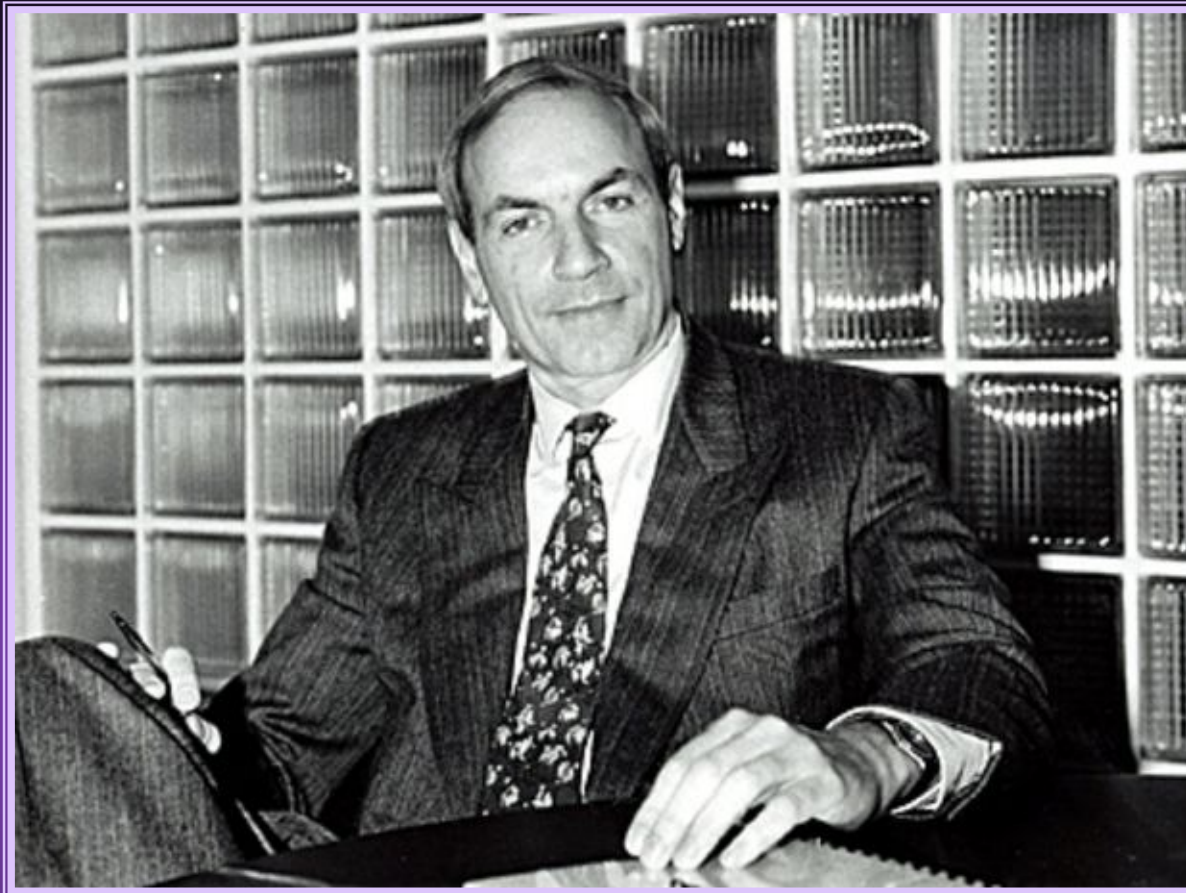
James Moody – 2010

and the catchy tune 967-11-11



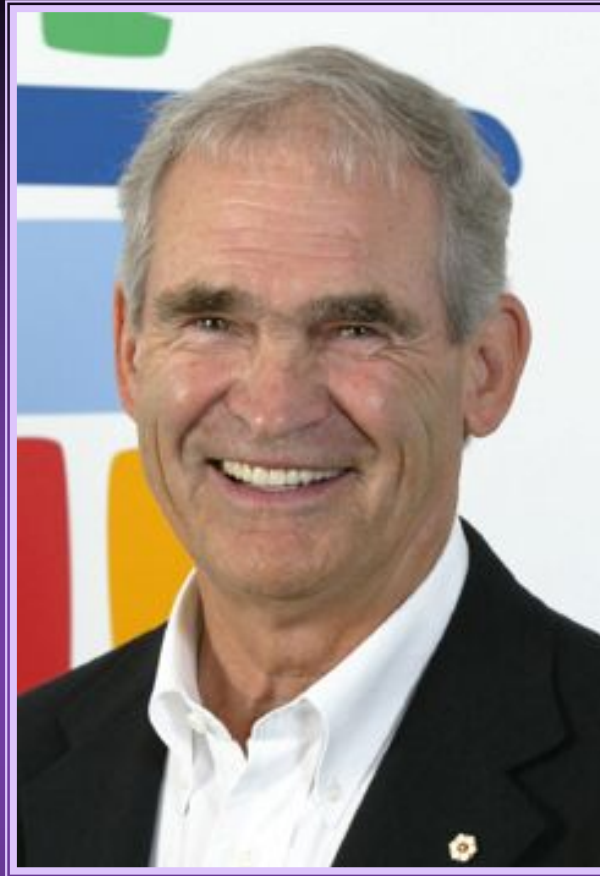
Hon. David Thompson - 2010

Prime Minister of Barbados & Minister of National Security



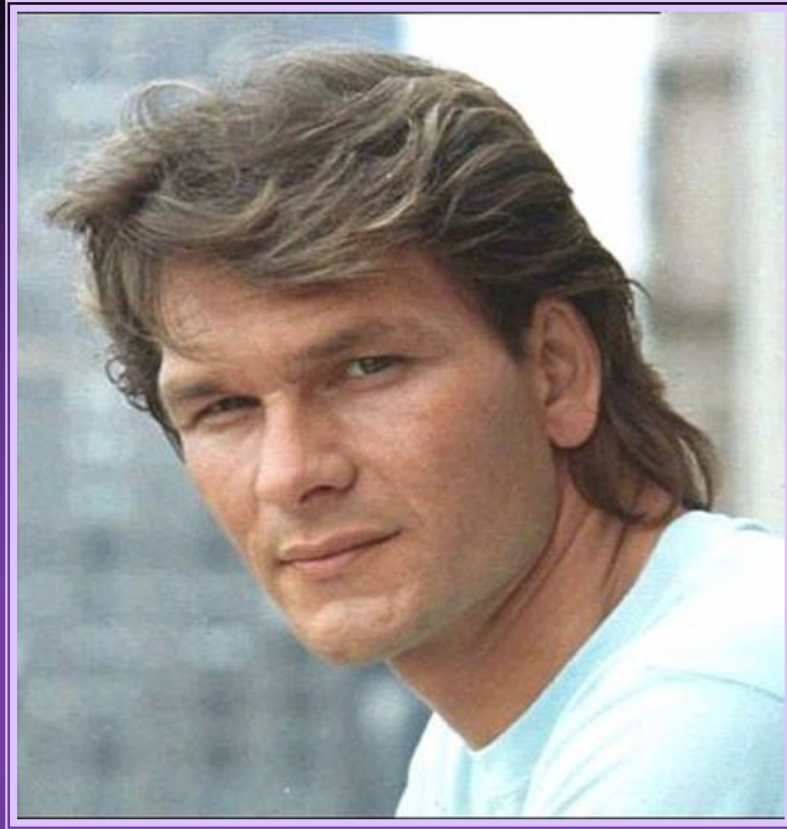
Claude Bechard- 2010

real estate developer and philanthropist



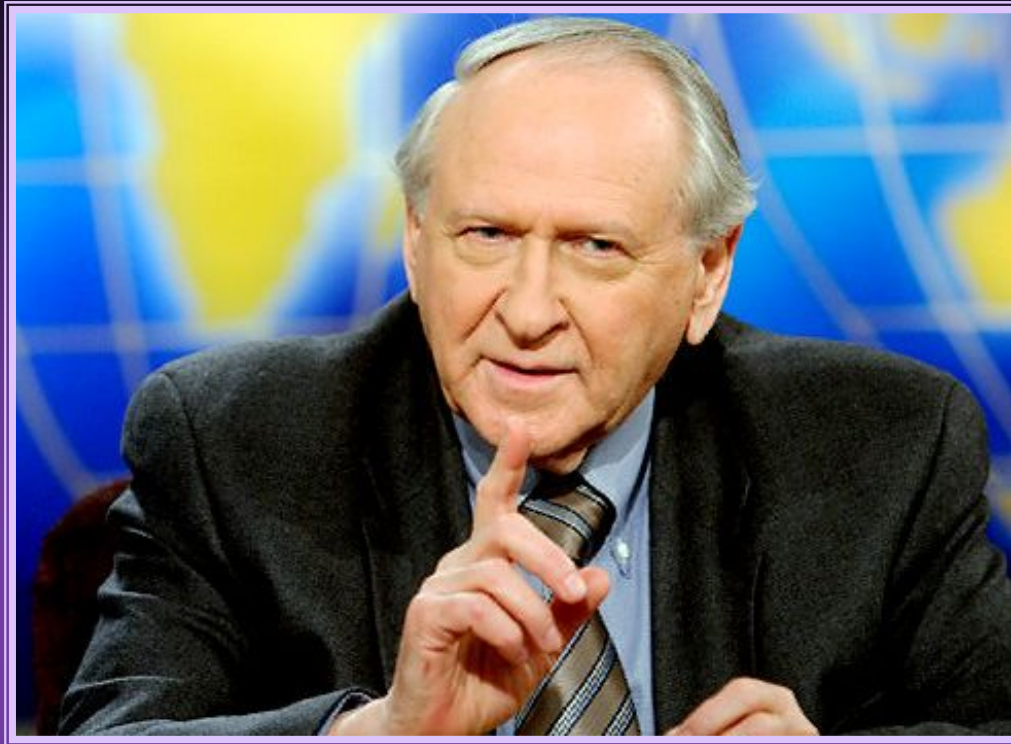
Patrick Swayze - 2009

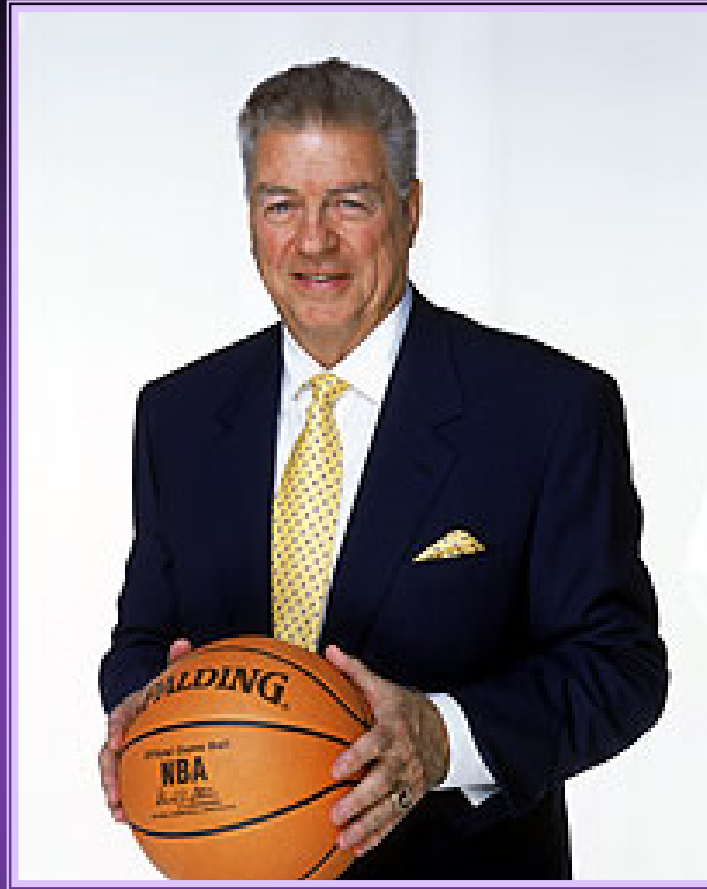
Myles Brand – 2009

Producer CBS & Creator of 60 minutes



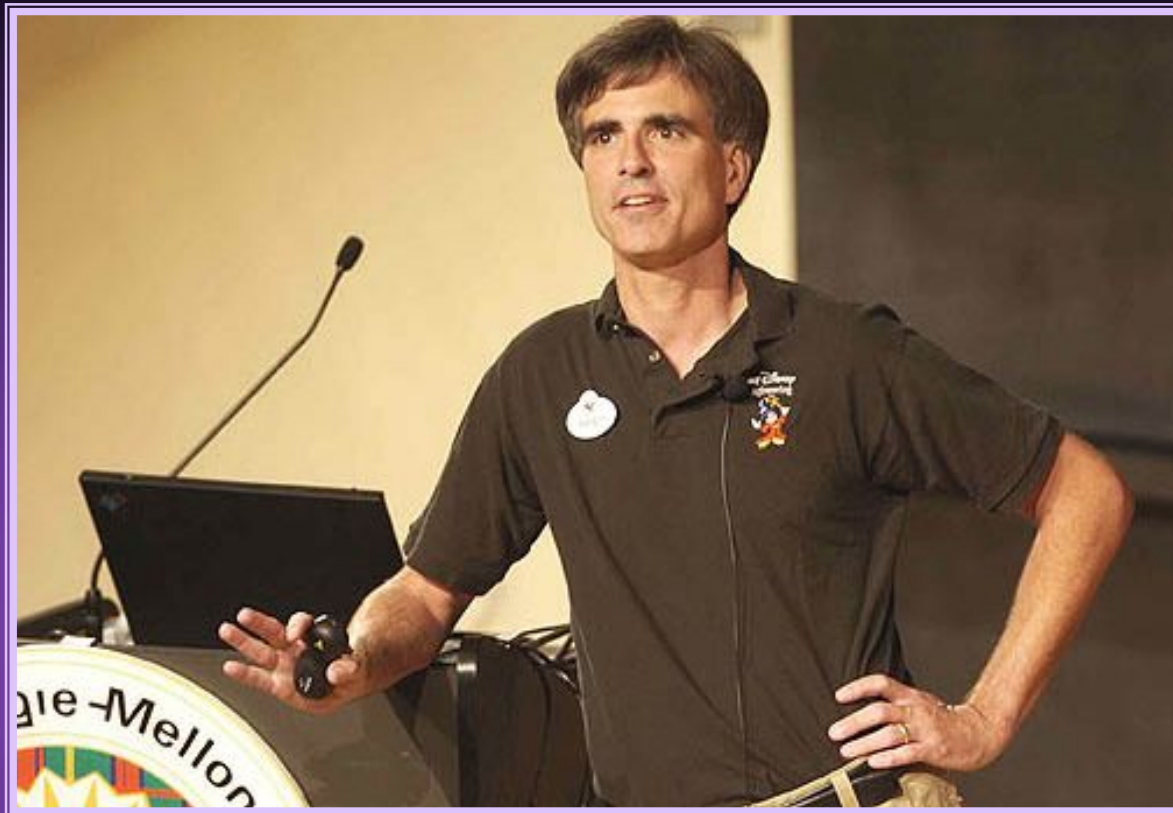
Chuck Daly – 2009

Carnegie-Mellon Professor and author of “The Last Lecture” and advocate for pancreatic cancer



Helen Gardiner - 2008

Philanthropist. Awarded the order of Canada. Co-founded the Gardiner Museum in Toronto with husband, George



Dith Pran – 2008

NY Times Photo Journalist and
Cambodian Genocide Survivor, his life was portrayed in the
academy award winning movie “The Killing Fields”



Ron Davis, M.D. – 2008

President of the American Medical Association and
a longtime advocate of healthy lifestyles



Luciano Pavarotti – 2007

Italian Operatic Tenor, who crossed over to pop music and became the most commercially successful tenor of all time. He was one of “The Three Tenors”.
Noted for his charity work for Red Cross and refugees



Willye Brown White – 2007

First American athlete to compete in 5 olympics - best long jumper for 2 decades. Won a silver in long jump in 1956 & a silver in the 400 metre relay in 1964.

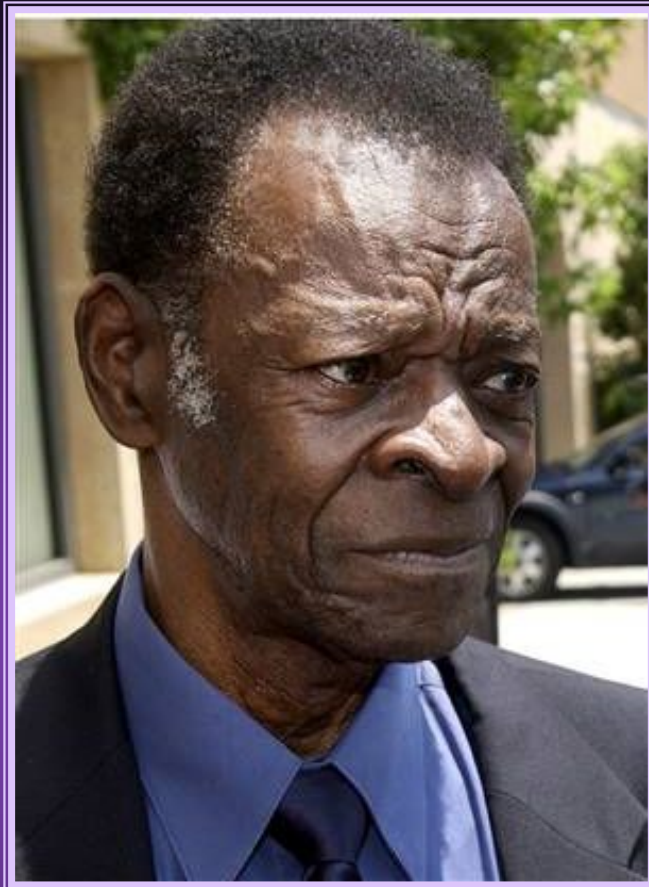
Remembered for her words

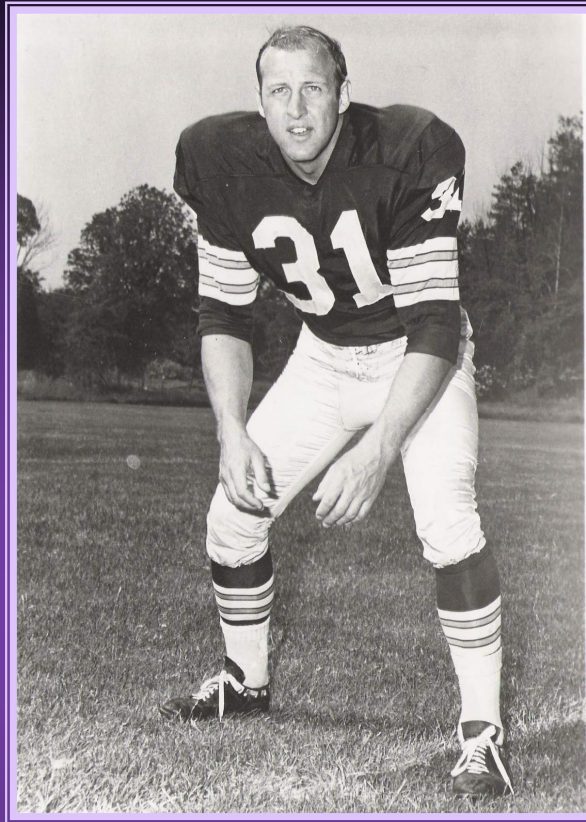
Arif Mardin – 2006

Actor, movies “Our Miss Brooks” and “Wait until Dark”



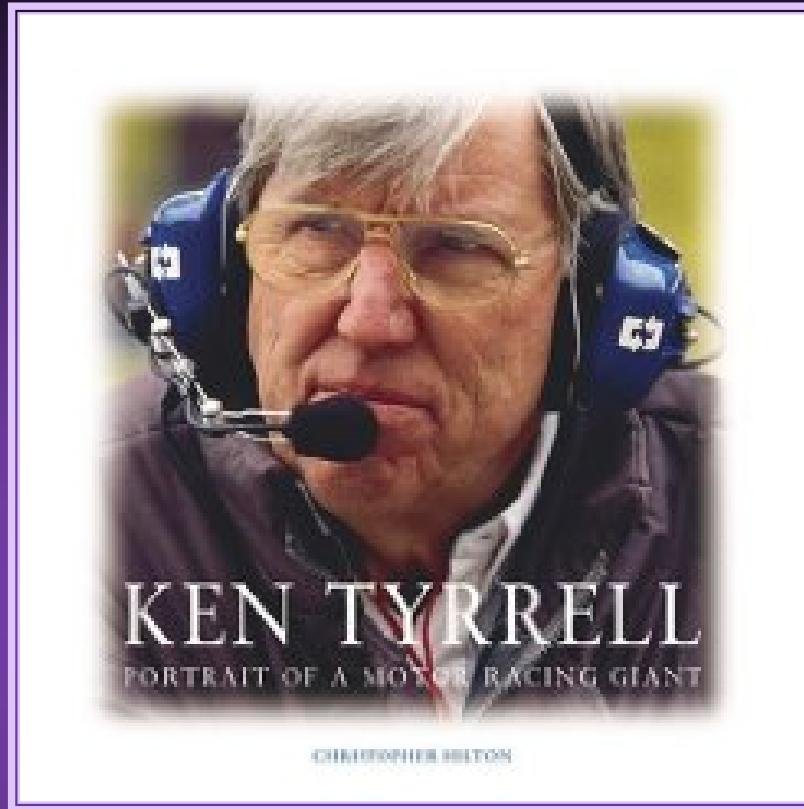
Ely Callaway – 2001

Magician



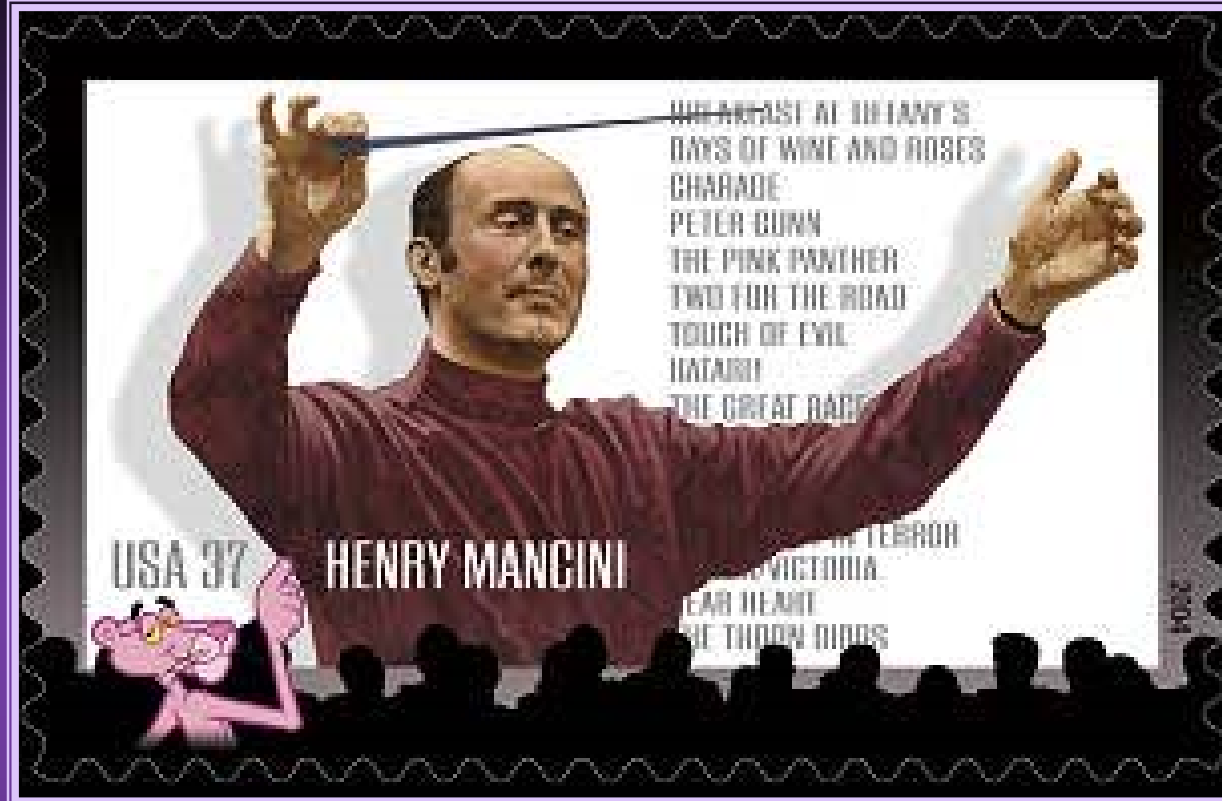
Juliet Prowse – 1996

Actress and dancer, movies – Can Can & GI Blues



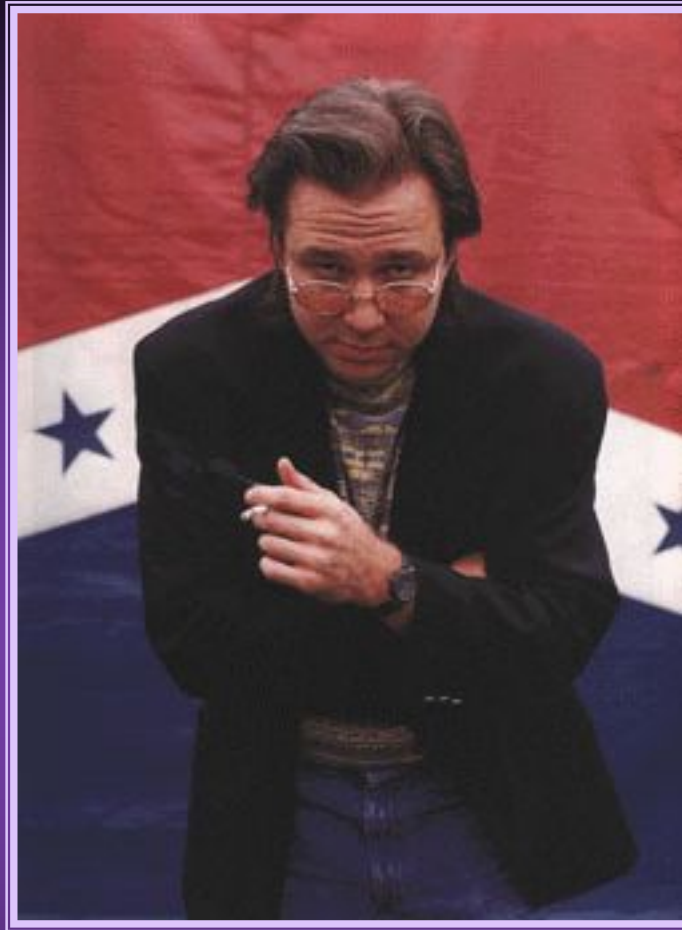
Marcello Mastroianni – 1996

Stand-up comedian, social critic and musician



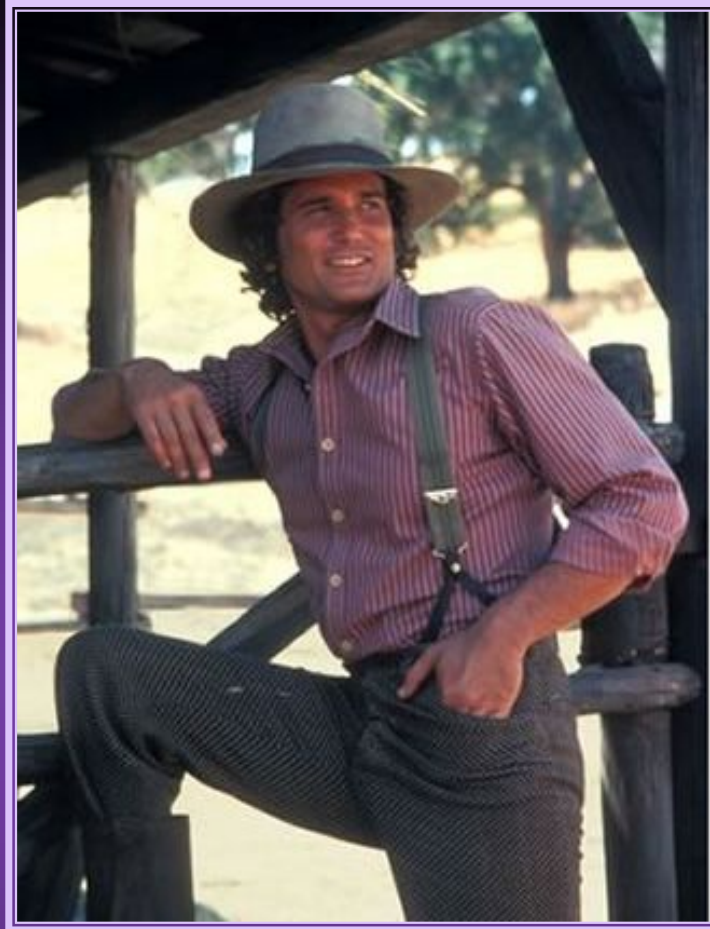
Fred Gwynne - 1993

Jazz trumpeter, bandleader, singer and composer



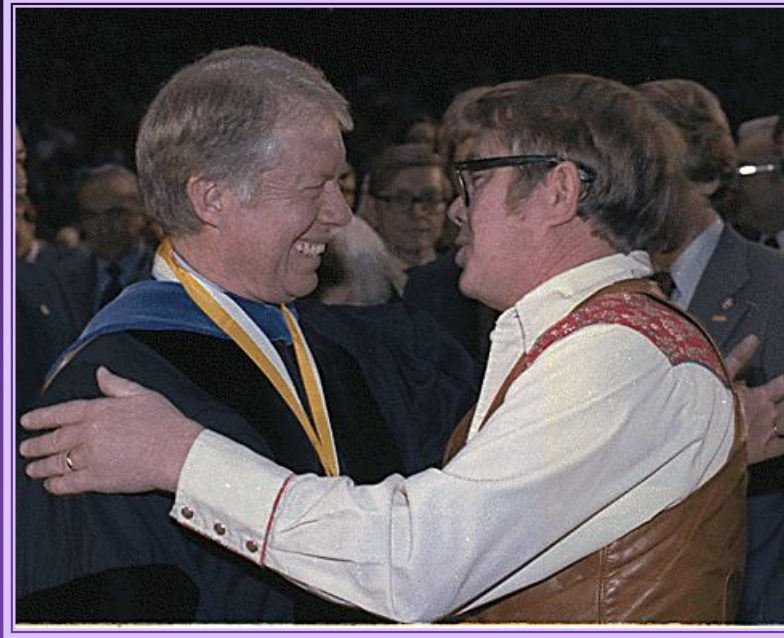
Michael Landon - 1991

President Jimmy Carter also lost his dad and his two sisters to pancreatic cancer



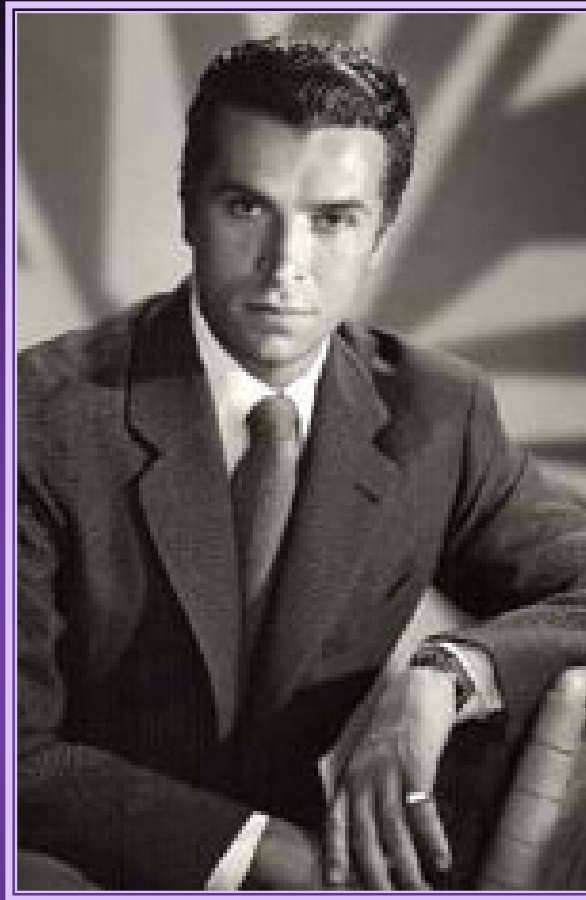
Donna Reed -1986

Jack Benny – 1974

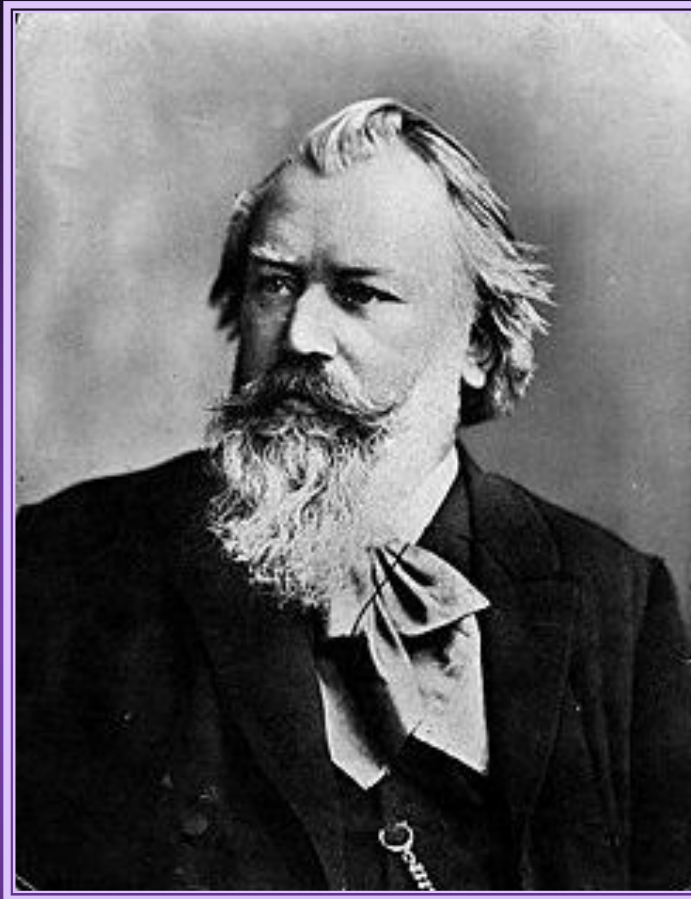
Comedian, vaudevillian and actor – radio and television
