## DIAGNOSIS TO DEATH: APPROX 3 TO 6 MONTHS HELP SHINE A LIGHT ON PANCREATIC CANCER

"Most *likely,* three to six months" is an all-too-common prognosis hurled at shocked pancreatic cancer patients at the time of their <u>initial diagnosis</u>. Amidst clever advertising campaigns, 10-K runs and corporate sponsorships for other cancers, pancreatic cancer will quietly kill approximately 4,300 of the 4,700 Canadians diagnosed this year. Do the math.

The survival rate – in the low single digits – for pancreatic cancer hasn't budged in the past three decades, while the survival rates for all other cancers have increased in the same time period, some dramatically.

Another stop-you-in-your-tracks fact about pancreatic cancer: the reason so few people know about it is because there are very few survivors. Cheerleaders are few and far between. Also, pancreatic cancer is the least funded cancer, receiving less than one per cent (1%) of all private and government funding.
