Pancreatic cancer is regarded as a "**silent**" disease because it is so difficult to detect and spreads so quickly.

There are no reliable screening tests, few specific symptoms, no proven treatments and no cure make it the deadliest form of cancer.

The average life expectancy of a person diagnosed with pancreatic cancer is just 3 to 6 months and the survival rate after five years is a dismal 6% - making it the deadliest form of cancer.

It is the only major cancer in which the survival rate has not improved in 40 years.
